Worcestershire Freemasons have donated £4,000 to the All Saints Youth Project at Kings Heath which will help to support young people, parents and carers during these difficult times.

Support and emotional wellbeing is so important when anxiety levels, confusion and loneliness strikes those confined to their homes especially whilst schools are forced to close.

All Saints aim is for every young person and young adult to have the opportunity to stay in touch, maintain positive and supportive relationships with staff and volunteers giving them the opportunity to respond to any worries and feelings expressed.

Using Zoom and Instagram, the project has set up virtual drop-in sessions and virtual inclusion sessions for young adults with additional needs. Their online presence has been enhanced to include live group activities, challenges, competitions, tasks and quiz games. The aim is to provide a platform for safe interaction, to overcome boredom and loneliness, to stimulate creativity and promote an active brain and body.
